- **Location** Donggimyeong-hang, Gupwa-eup, Jeju (Near the Gimyeong Beach)
- **Date of the opening of the school** March 29, 2010
- **Subjects of operation** Jeju Sea Grant of Jeju National University + Gimyeong-ri
- **The number of operating staff** Four(1 school president, 1 administrative staff member, 1 teacher, 1 assistant teacher)
- **Training devices** 10 dinghy yachts, 1 emergency rescue boat, 2 cruise liners, suit, and life jacket

Main activities

- Research the current human resources and material infrastructure concerning Korean yachting and implement DR
- Investigate famous marina facilities at home and abroad and develop Jeju type contents
- Run Jeju International Yacht School and develop an educational program
- Conduct education related to maritime reports, yacht theory, and field training

Operational effects

- **Technical effects**
 - Furnish practical data for the policies of political departments related to maritime reports (tour and of civil) servants in local governments
 - Promote the enhancement of the quality of maritime physical education in school through the program development model according to the class and stage of the yacht school program
- **Social-economic effects**
 - Create new jobs through the cultivation of maritime reports professionals
 - Generate the profits for local governments through the operation of a yacht school and expand the base of the maritime reports population
 - Expand the base of the maritime reports population of Jeju-do, a natural tourist attraction
 - Committed to the expansion of the maritime reports population on a family unit
